1 SCOPE This Standard specifies a series of codes to be used in EDIFACT messages, within Australia, identifying Australian ports which are used in the loading or unloading of cargo.

2 REFERENCED DOCUMENT The following document is referred to in this Standard:

2632 Codes for the representation of names of countries.

3 INTERNATIONAL USE; UNITED NATIONS LOCATION CODES (UN/LOCODES) The UN/LOCODE for each of the ports detailed in Clause 4 is formed by prefixing the Australian port code with the Alpha-2 code for Australia (AU) from AS 2632.

For example, the UN/LOCODE for Yampi Sound (YAM) would be AUYAM.
